Haaken Narveson Gronhovd

Pg 137- Gerhard Naeseth book 1847-1848--Haagen Narvesen Grønhovd (23) emigrated from Sigdal, Bu, to the Rock Prairie settlement, WI; later to Spring Grove township. He came on the ship Porsgrund which arrive in New York on July 7, 1848 with 141 passengers, having sailed from Porsgrunn, Telemark on May 14, 1848. Captain H. C. Arveschou. Died from cerebral meningitis.

Among the very first Norwegian settlers in the Spring Grove area in 1852 was Haaken Narveson, born 1825, died 1880 at the age of 56. He married Astrid Olsdtr. Roningen or Rudningen who was born 1829 and died in 1896 at the age of 66. She was the daughter of Ole and Randi Rudningen. Haaken was the son of Narve Haakensen Gronhovd and his wife Gunhild Haldorsdtr. from Sigdal Norway.

Spring Grove Herald - 6 Feb 1896 - Astri Narveson died at the home of her daughter, Mrs. A. J. Johnson of Spring Grove on Tuesday February 4th, 1896 at the age of sixty-six years.

She was born near Næs, Hallingdal, Norway September 29, 1829. After emigrating to America, she lived some time in Illinois and then came to Spring Grove from that state in 1853. During that year she was joined in marriage to Haaken Narveson, who preceeded her to the realms of eternal rest about sixteen years ago. Mrs. Narveson and her husband were among the pioneers of this community and their marriage is thought to have been the first solemnized at this place.

The surviving children left to mourn the loss of a kind and beloved mother, are Mrs. Gunhild Storrie of Kensett, Iowa; Olaf Narveson of Harmony, Minnesota; Mrs. A. J. Johnson, Mars. K. C. Storlie and Narve,

January 11, 1906 - Mrs. S. Store of Hanlinton, Iowa is here for a visit with her brother, Henry Narveson.

Randi H. Narveson

She was born on the Old Narveson Homestead. She was baptized by Rev. V. Koren and Confirmed by Rev. St. S. Reque. Her husband and four children preceded her in death. She spent all her life at the home where she was born, raised and died with the exception of a few years of her early married life which was spent at Grand Meadow, MN. She was a member of the Bethlehem Ladies Aid and at the time of her death was its oldest member. She had been in failing health for many years and she had been confined to her bed for the last week before her death. She is survived by 14 grandchildren. Funeral services were held Wednesday Dec 21 at one o'clock from the home and later from Trinity Church. Rev. Oscar Mikkelson officiated.

Ingeborg Narveson

In the church records it states she was born in 1859 and she was thirty-seven years old when she died. She had a dau that was born the same day (Apr 03, 1896)

Narve Narveson

September 24, 1914 - Carl Erickson and crew finished the Narve Narveson barn Saturday.

Narve Narveson passed away on Friday July 1st. Narve had been in poor health for some time, suffering a slight stroke ten years ago. He was this time stricken while driving into town and was unconscious all the time until his death.

Mr. Narveson being born and raised in this community of Haakon and Astrid Narveson. He was born on June 17th, 1863. Mr. Narveson was married twice. First to Lina Storlie, which one son, Hartwig Cornelius of this marriage survives. His second marriage was with Hannah Rosendahl on October 23, 1898. To them four children were born: Percival, Gladys, Clifford and Inez (deceased). Mr. Narveson was a very good man, who enjoyed the respect of all his neighbors and acquaintances. Funeral services were held on Tue. July 5th at the church. Rev. A. O. Johnson officiated. Buried in West End Cemetery. Spring Grove Herald - July 7th, 1927

LUMBER YARDS

1919 History of Houston County: Martin K. Storlie one of the proprietors of the Spring Grove Lumber Company, a well-known and flourishing business concern, was born on a farm in sections 9 and 10, Spring Grove Township, this county, March 13, 1870, son of Knute and Anna (Skorgen) Storlie. He acquired his elementary education in district school #55 and later attended Breckenridge Institute at Decorah, Iowa, completing a three years' course in 1888. After that until 1891, he was engaged as a farm laborer and then went to Revillo, South Dakota where he was employed for a year and a half as clerk by William Storlie. In 1893 he returned to Spring Grove and in that fall entered the general store of

Asle Hålverson as clerk, being thus employed until the following year. Then buying the interest of Lars Budahl in his lumber business in Spring Grove, he became associated as partner with Narve Narveson, the firm conducting business under the style of Storlie & Narveson. In 1896 Mr. Narveson sold his interest to Olson & Newhouse of Mabel, Minnesota and the firm became that of Storlie, Olson & Newhouse, which it remained until 1896. Mr. Newhouse then sold his interest to Nils Onsgard, a banker of Spring Grove, and the style of the firm was changed to Onsgard & Storlie, the two proprietors conducting the business until 1912, when, on the admission of Gerhard Roverud as a third partner, the present Spring Grove Lumber Company was formed and has since remained unchanged as to name. In the same year that the company was formed the C. L. Coleman yard was purchased and the two concerns consolidated. In 1914, Mr. Onsgard died and his interest was taken over by his widow, who remains as one of the company, each partner owing a one-third interest, with Mr. Storlie as the acting manager. The concern is one of the substantial business enterprises of Spring Grove and as one of its owners, Mr. Storlie is numbered among the prosperous citizens of the village, where he owns a comfortable one-and-a-half story residence of seven rooms. He also owns 150 acres of land just on the edge of the village, as well as 160 acres near Balta, ND. Though ostentatious, he is a good businessman and takes a keen interest in the prosperity and advancement of the community in which he resides. In politics he is a Republican.

Olaf Narveson

Olaf never married.

8 Feb 1893 - A section of the rear of Ramstad and Narveson's shoe store has been fitted up as a shoe shop and is now occupied by Andrew Skaar.

18 Jan 1894 - A. J. Johnson & Co. have sold their stock of merchandise to J. J. Ramstad and Olaf Narveson who will open up an exclusive Boot and Shoe establishment in the near future under the firm name of Ramstad and Narveson.

1 Feb 1894 - E. A. Flaskerud has just finished up the interior decorations of C. Engell's store building and today, Feb. 1st, Messrs Ramstad and Narveson open up therein the largest and finest stock of boots and shoes ever shown in Southeastern Minnesota. (See Christian Engell - buildings)

29 Nov 1894 - Ramstad and Narveson - Ladies Fine Kid Shoes \$2.50 now \$2.00 and those formerly \$2.00 now \$1.35.

Sep 1895 - Olaf Narveson came down from Harmony Sunday to help cheer for his Spring Grove friends in the ball contest.

7 Jan 1897 - Olaf Narveson Harmony's popular clothier, was a caller in town Tuesday evening.

21 Jul 1904 - Olaf Narveson, Oliver Onsgard and Carl Clemetson are down to New Albin enjoying a few days' river recreation. Steve Randall will see that the boys are well taken care of; he will furnish them with a tent, fishing tackle and cooking utensils. They will try and make the acquaintance of the finny tribe; will awaken and arise in the morning listening to the song of the mosquitoes; and will see that "Old Sol" adds to their comfort as they play along the river's bank.

28 July 1904 - The fishermen, Oliver Onsgard, Olaf Narveson and Carl Clemetson, returned from New Albin Saturday evening no worse for the wear and tear of a few days outing. Only for a few minutes on their arrival here did they show signs of fatigue when they discovered that their fish were being carried on thru. Luckily tho the passenger stopped to take water and they got their fish before it had gone further. Someone evidently wished to play a joke on them and had the fish billed for another place.

March 25, 1908 - Olaf Narveson's familiar face may again be seen at Henry Fladager's clothing store.

Mr. Narveson has been conducting a branch store at New Albin, the past winter for Mr. Fladager, but having discontinued the business at New Albin for the present, Olaf will again take up his old job in Mr. Fladager's clothing store at this place

28 Jan 1909 -Olaf Narveson left Saturday morning for New Albin, IA on business matters.

5 Jul 1917 - Olaf Narveson suffered a stroke of paralysis Saturday afternoon at the Carl Muller farm. While in the act of taking out tobacco plants he was siezed and fell into the tobacco bed. He was taken to the home of his sister, Mrs. Martin Storlie in this town and is now a little better.

Funeral services for Olaf Narveson who passed away at the home of Martin Storlie on Thursday were held from the N.E.L. church on Wednesday afternoon, Rev. A. O. Johnson officiated. Mr. Narveson was born on the Narveson homestead northwest of Spring Grove on November 2, 1866. He had lived on the farm homestead practically all his life. He is survived by three sisters and one brother. Mrs. A. J. Johnson, Mrs. Martin Storlie, Mrs. S. Storrie and N. H. Narveson.

He probably had TB as he bled from the lungs.

Inger Maria Narveson

She died at her home very peacefully on April 1st at 9:00 p.m. following an illness of several months being confined to her bed the last four weeks. She was baptized and confirmed by Rev. S. S. Reque. She was the last survivor of a family of nine children. Preceding her in death were Gunhild (Mrs. S. Storre); Randi (Mrs. A. J. Johnson); Ingeborg (Mrs. K. Storlie); Narve; Olaf; Jorgen and Henry Narveson and two children who died in infancy, Narve and Maria.

Mrs. Storlied had enjoyed excellent health all her life until the last half year. She was an honorary member of the Spring Grove Ladies Aid Society, always willing to accept responsibilities in the work of the church. Funeral services were held on Monday April 6 from the home and later from the church. Rev. Oscar Mikkelson officiated. Pallbearers were: Olaf Kieland, Haakon Johnson, Alfred Storlie, Percival Narveson, Clifford Narveson and Henry Burtness.

January 11, 1906 - Mrs. S. Store of Hanlintown, Iowa is here for a visit with her brother, Henry Narveson.

Caledonia Journal - May 31, 1899 - Spring Grove News - Henry Narveson, traveling salesman for La Crescent woolen mills was visiting with home folks last week.

Sp Grove Herald - 4 Jan 1900 - Henry Narveson called on friends in town Tuesday.

4 Jan 1900 - Henry Narveson went through on Saturday night's passenger, bound for Preston to celebrate the advent of the new year.

1 Feb 1900 - Henry Narveson went to New Albin Wed on a business trip.

15 Feb 1900 - Messrs Henry Narveson and Martin Fladager were royally entertained at the pleasant home of Mr. and Mrs. Jed Pope on South Prairie while on their way home from New Albin, IA, Tuesday.

8 Mar 1900 - Ole Hendrickson and Henry Narveson entered the precincts of Caledonia Tues for courting purposes.

8 Mar 1900 - Henry Narveson went to Chicago Wed on a pleasure trip.

10 May 1900 - Henry Narveson spent Tuesday at the county seat.

10 May 1900 - Henry Narveson visited over Sunday with friends at Preston.

24 May 1900 - Henry Narveson called on friends at New Albin and Lansing Tuesday.

He was 31 3/4 year old when he died. He died from T. B. at the home of his sister, Mrs. Martin Storlie with whom he had largely made his home since he was taken sick. He was an intelligent, honest and pleasant young man well liked by his employers, associates, friends in fact by the whole public whom he largely dealt with while employed at Fladager's clothing establishment where he stayed continuously for seven years, from 1894 to 1901 and a part of the time for the past five years, he was traveling for wholesale clothing firms, who found him a very good salesman and rapidly increased his salary. At the funeral which took place Thur Feb 1st, the church was packed with people who had assembled to pay a last tribute of respect to a departed friend. Beautiful flowers presented by friends and relatives of the deceased adorned the casket. Services were conducted by Rev Reque who delivered a very impressive and able sermon, after which Rev. Wein spoke a few well directed words in English. He never married.
